

Immune Responses and Symptoms in Lyme Disease Patients and Healthy Controls

We are looking for Healthy Participants to help advance Lyme research taking place at Stanford University.

You could be included in this important research if you:

- **have never been diagnosed with Lyme disease**
- **are an adult aged 21 years or older**
- **speak and read English**
- **have never been homeless**
- **since 2005 have not taken antibiotics everyday for 2 consecutive years**
- **have no immediate family members ever diagnosed with Lyme disease**

This study will evaluate and compare the sensitivity of various Lyme disease tests to their clinical diagnoses and test results of persons who are healthy and have never been diagnosed with Lyme disease.

Participants will have their blood drawn for diagnostic tests used for Lyme disease. Following this, they will complete questionnaires related to quality of life, demographics, distress, medical symptoms and treatment, coping and pain during a one-time 2 to 3 hour visit at Stanford University.
